in its landmark report health literacy a prescription to end confusion the institute of medicine noted that there are 90 million adults in the united states with limited health literacy who cannot fully benefit from what the health and health care systems have to offer since the release of that report health literacy has become a vibrant research field that has developed and disseminated a wide range of tools and practices that have helped organizations ranging in size from large health care systems to individual health care providers and pharmacists to engage in health literate discussions with and provide health literate materials for patients and family members improving the health literacy of organizations can be an important component of addressing the social determinants of health and achieving the triple aim of improving the patient experience improving the health of populations and reducing the cost of care however the focus on organizations does not address the larger issue of how to improve health literacy across the u s population to get a better understanding of the state of community based health literacy interventions the roundtable on health literacy hosted a workshop on july 19 2017 on community based health literacy interventions it featured examples of community based health literacy programs discussions on how to evaluate such programs and the actions the field can take to embrace this larger view of health literacy this publication summarizes the presentations and discussions from the workshop

there is growing evidence from developed and developing countries that community based approaches are effective in improving the health of individuals and populations this is especially true when the social determinants of health are considered in the design of the community based approach with an aging population and an emphasis on health promotion the united states is increasingly focusing on community based health and health care preventing disease and promoting health calls for a holistic approach to health interventions that rely more heavily upon interprofessional collaborations however the financial and structural design of health professional education remains siloed and largely focused on academic health centers for training despite these challenges there are good examples of interprofessional community based programs and curricula for educating health professionals in may 2014 members of the institute of medicine s global forum on innovation in health professional education came together to substantively delve into issues affecting the scale up and spread of health professional education in communities participants heard a wide variety of individual accounts from innovators about work they are undertaking and opportunities for education with communities in presenting a variety of examples that range from student community service to computer modeling the workshop aimed to stimulate discussions about how educators might better integrate education with practice in communities building health workforce capacity through community based health professional education summarizes the presentations

in 1994 an institute of medicine committee was convened to study comprehensive school health programs cshps in grades k 12 and to make recommendations for national state and local actions the background of the study issues considered by the committee and an overview of cshps are discussed in the first two chapters of this report the remainder of the report discusses the four topics of school health that the committee examined in depth education services infrastructure and research and evaluation based on research on physical and health education the committee recommends that 1 all students receive sequential age appropriate health education every year during the elementary and middle or junior high grades 2 a one

semester high quality health education course at the secondary level become a requirement for high school graduation and 3 all elementary teachers receive preparation in health education content and methodology during their preservice training based on research on services the committee recommends that 1 school health services be formally planned and their quality be continuously monitored 2 research be conducted on school based services 3 confidentiality of health records be given high priority and 4 established sources of funding for school health services continue from both public health and education funds and new approaches be developed based on research on cshp infrastructure the committee recommends that 1 the mission of the federal interagency committee on school health be revitalized with the help of an official advisory committee and participation of individual national coordinating committee on school health member organizations at the state and local levels 2 a formal organization with broad representation be established in every school district 3 individual schools establish a school health committee and appoint a coordinator to oversee the school health program and 4 to implement high quality cshps the training and utilization of competent properly prepared personnel be expanded recommendations for research and evaluation of cshps include the following 1 pursuing an active research agenda on cshps to fill critical knowledge gaps with increased emphasis on basic research and outcome evaluation and on dissemination of these findings 2 launching a major research effort to establish model comprehensive programs and to develop approaches to their study and 3 studying further each of the individual components of a cshp nine appendices include guidelines for cshps and federal funding streams for cshps lpp

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
